### About The Museum

Tāmaki Paenga Hira Auckland War Memorial Museum is New Zealand's largest museum, caring for more than 4.5 million taonga. We are Auckland's home of commemoration, New Zealand's oldest research institution, an education facility, and a major tourism destination. We employ approximately 300 people and have over 200 volunteers who kindly donate their time to us.

We offer a rich and fulfilling work life where we embrace diversity and nurture our bicultural capability as demonstrated in our Teu le Vā and He Korahi Māori strategies. We also offer a great range of benefits such as flexible work and leave, insurances, and an award-winning wellbeing programme.

### Purpose & Context for the Role

Auckland War Memorial Museum Tāmaki Paenga Hira protects and cares for approximately 6 million objects in collections that have been built over 170 years. The collections range from Documentary Heritage material to Human History objects and Natural Sciences specimens, each telling a story that helps interpret, understand, and illuminate the history of Aotearoa and its people.

This position is within the Collection Information and Access department, which is part of the Collections and Research directorate. The role and contribution of this team are at the heart of Auckland Museum's priorities outlined in the Five-Year Strategy, making Auckland Museum's collections available onsite, offsite and online.

Auckland Museum is undertaking an exciting new digital infrastructure project, developing a new API for its two main online access platforms Online Cenotaph and Collections Online. This full-time, one-year, contract position will support the team working on this project.

The Data Analyst will play a key role in preparing, validating, and optimising museum collection data for integration into the new Collections Online API. This role will focus on data cleaning, export, ingestion, and testing processes, working closely with Museum staff to ensure accuracy, consistency, and adherence to best practice in data management. The position will also support partner data export mapping and quality assurance to ensure the API delivers high-quality, reliable information to users and partners.

The purpose of this role:

- Vernon CMS data cleaning projects as required for Collections Online and Online Cenotaph
- Support Museum staff with export of collection data from Vernon CMS
- Support Museum staff with ingest of collection data to the new API
- Support Museum staff with testing of display and accuracy of data ingested into the new API
- Support Museum staff with mapping and testing collection data partner export functionality
- To ensure best practice is adhered to for data management throughout the course of the project.

The Museum is a bicultural workplace and the person in this role will uphold the principles of He Korahi Māori and Teu Le Vā.
